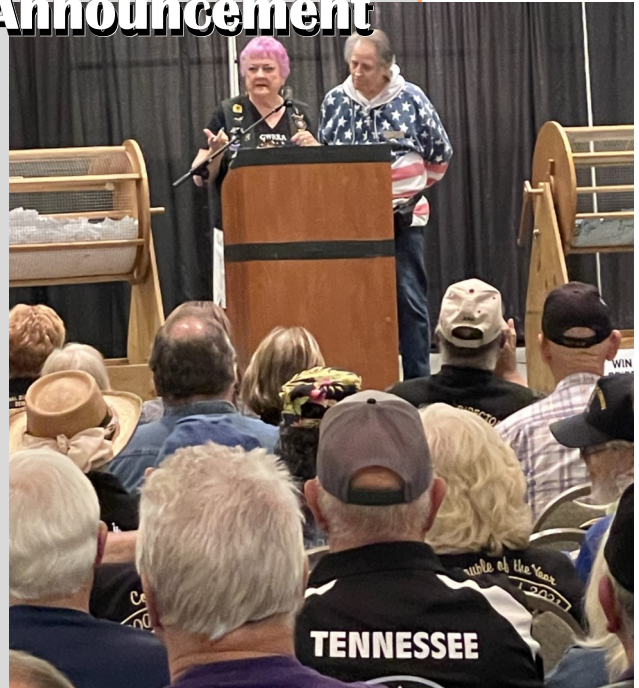

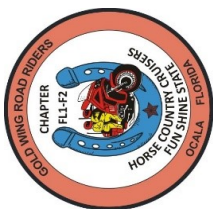

is incapacitated and is in need of that kit?

Would other members on the ride be able to quickly find it without your assistance?

Any GWRRA member who is a Level 3 or higher is required to carry their own first aid kit, but this is not a perfect world and it could be possible they do not have one with them.

In an emergency, it is possible for people to go into panic mode and they might not be thinking clearly as they frantically search for it.

What could we do to make it easier to locate a kit in an emergency? You could place "FIRST AID KIT" vinyl stickers on the exterior of your bike, trike, or trailer to indicate its location.

Attached are photos of what the stickers look like and where you could mount them. They can be purchased on Amazon or various places on line for a couple of dollars.

You or someone in your chapter may also carry an Automated External Defibrillator, AED, with them. It would also be necessary to quickly locate this device in an emergency.

Vinyl stickers for that device can also be purchased and placed on the outside of the location on your bike, trike, or trailer where it can be found.

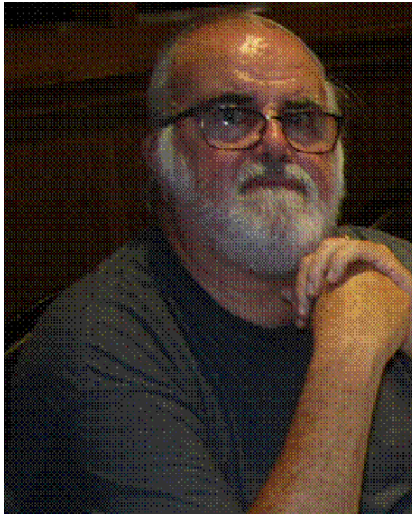

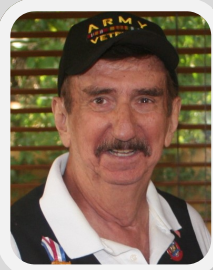

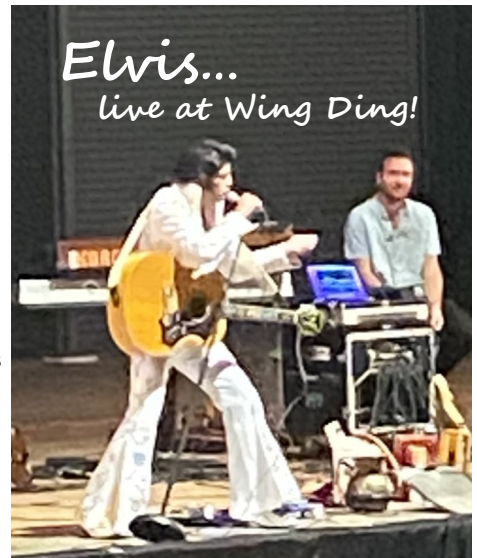

Well, this breakfast ride to Bett's Big T restaurant turned out to be a great find. This little diner is located on Young Blvd., in Chiefland.

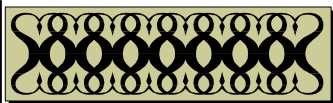
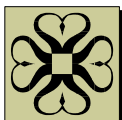
With the weather threatening, the turn out wasn't so big, but it was a good ride and with only a few sprinkles finding us on the way home. Our fun wasn't dampened.

Dan and Barb Lindsey led the ride, which was direct to the restaurant from Publix parking lot, because of the "rain threat."

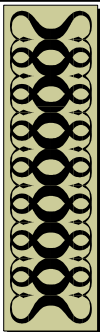
